SLRA Community Quilt

To deepen that feeling of togetherness, the women decided to make a community quilt. With the help of our wonderful volunteers, we sent out craft kits to each woman, recorded explain videos, and sewed together via Zoom.



On International Women's Day 2021, we had a big online celebration where we unveiled the community quilt, and we're really excited displaying the SLRA quilt at the Wandsworth Arts Fringe for the first time! The quilt tells the women's stories, struggles, and hopes. For many women the community quilt helped them through the difficulties during lockdown and symbolizes the strength and power of the women's group.
